



For the **HARDWOOD FLOOR**, Whelan used pine boards salvaged during the renovation of her house. She built the **SINK STAND** with leftover oak purchased for other rooms. Equally handy DIYers can find **SALVAGED PINE** at Provenance for \$3-\$6 per square foot or remilled salvaged pine (read: easier to install) for \$6-\$9 per square foot. **ALUMINUM AND GLASS SHELVES**, similar items from \$57 at homedepot.com. **MIRROR**, \$150 at Gordon & Sons Glass and Mirrors.



THE \$7,000 BATHROOM

When it came to tackling the master bath in her Queen Village townhome, *recherché* Philadelphia architect Juliet Whelan knew just how to keep the project affordable and personal: "I thought of it as found-object art. It was very improvisational," she says. Her materials: salvaged wood, free-form tile, a splurge-worthy sink basin, and eyefuls of glass. The result: A soothing space that's crafty and creative, airy and bright.
